-FAMILY AGREEMENT-

The following conditions, detailed in our Host Family Guide, must be honoured on acceptance of our students.

1. The student must be welcomed into your home as a member of your family.
2. The maximum number of students to be hosted at any one time (including those from other Organisations) is three. Accommodation must be in a twin room and a single room, **not three in the same room**. Each student must have use of a wardrobe and drawer space. No-one should be expected to live out a suitcase.
3. Unless specifically requested, no student speaking the same “mother tongue” may be accommodated in the same house.
4. Clean sheets/towels are to be provided on a weekly basis.
5. Either yourself, a member of the family or responsible friend, must be available to meet your students on arrival and to return with them on departure. Any costs incurred for these journeys must be met by you, not the student.
6. Neither Irish Education Partners nor persons acting on our behalf can be held responsible for date/time changes or cancellation of booking.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE CONDITIONS GIVEN ABOVE AND IN THE IRISH EDUCATION PARTNERS HOST FAMILY BOOKLET WILL MEAN REMOVAL OF THE STUDENT WITHOUT COMPENSATION.

THE CHILDREN ACT 1989

There are legal responsibilities for host families accommodating students, under the Children Act 1989. Since children have only a limited ability to communicate in English when they come to visit this country and could obviously be vulnerable while away from their families, the Act provides an indispensable element of protection for children. Should any of the following conditions apply to you (or to any person living in your household) we would not be able to entrust you with one of our students and we ask you to report the situation immediately to your Local Organiser. Therefore before entrusting you with a student we kindly ask you to sign a statement on the Host family form declaring that the Children Act not apply to you or to any person living in your household. Thank you for your help in this matter.

We are confident that you would want the same assurance if a family in another country were hosting your son or daughter.

The following people are **NOT** allowed to host children:

- Anyone who has been convicted of an offence against a child.
- Anyone whose parental rights over a child have been taken over by a local authority
- Anyone who has had a child removed from their care by order of court
- Anyone who has had an order made against him/her refusing or cancelling registration under the Nurseries and Childminders Act 1948 or the Children Act 1989.
